Since February 15, 1989, I have committed to one simple rule...



Once the coins enter the jar, they do not come out until a truly worthy cause crosses my heart. In the 33 years of this jar, this will only be the fourth time this jar has been emptied. That is how much this cause has touched my heart ... So please value and make each PENNY count.

Time to bring it home ... There are more pennies in this world than any other coins and far far more than any of the other dollar bill amount. Equally, there are far more of us "Penny People" in this world than those with wealth. The question is, do you understand your true gifts, value, and potential?
